THEOLOGY ROUND TABLE

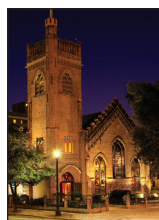

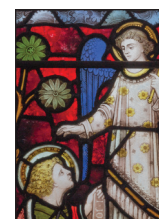
