Ways to Make Your Pledge

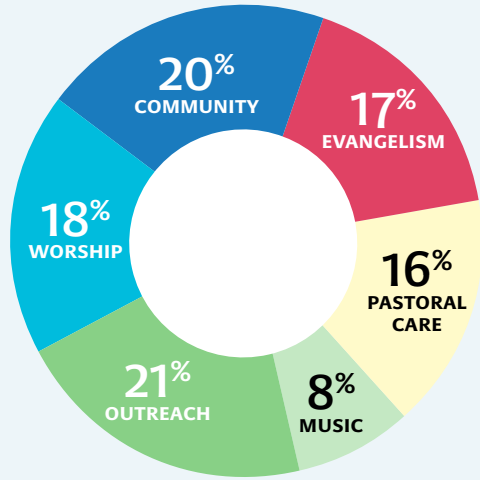
When it comes to making your pledge for the upcoming year, there are many options available.

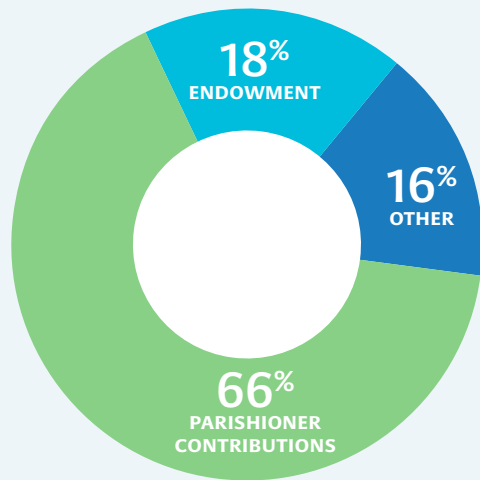

In the current year, we have been able to respond to God's call in creative ways, but as a people of faith we know that God never calls us to complacency. We have a devoted congregation, excellent clergy and staff, award-winning music, high quality online worship services and virtual offerings, and a beautiful campus that spans two city blocks. The momentum and growth of our parish points to a hopeful future as we grow in service to God, our community, and to one another. Please help us build momentum by making your 2021 EMC pledge as early as you can.

In order to faithfully ensure God's future for Christ Church Cathedral, we need the financial support of every parishioner. The costs of financing Cathedral ministries, even at the level they currently exist, increase every year. With gratitude, we share that last year 603 families made a pledge to

Christ Church Cathedral for a total of \$3.34 million. In order to responsibly fund the 2021 budget, the vestry anticipates that we will need \$3.4 million in pledges. That's a 3 percent increase over last year's pledge total.

We encourage everyone to participate in this year's Every Member Canvass, regardless of the amount. Your investment in Christ Church Cathedral will ensure that we remain financially strong and continue to serve through our many wonderful ministries.

The key to living a financially generous life is prayerful and thoughtful discernment. We encourage you to pledge an amount that is both responsible and audacious. A tithe is 10% of one's income, a goal that is often reached after incremental increases each year. The chart beside may help you decide how much to pledge during 2021.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Every Member Canvass (EMC)? What does it support?

The Every Member Canvass (EMC) is the annual fundraising pledge campaign that supports the mission and yearly programs of the church. The EMC funds the Cathedral's annual operating budget to enable our common life and outreach in the community for the coming year.

What is a pledge? Why should I pledge?

Parish members are asked to make a pledge of financial support to sustain our mission and ministry in the coming calendar year (2021). Making your pledge allows the Vestry to budget responsibly and ensure with confidence that the Cathedral's programmatic needs will be met. New pledges and increases in pledge commitments allow us both to meet increases in annual fixed costs and expand ministry budgets to provide more robust programming and outreach efforts.

How do I fulfill my pledge?

Christ Church Cathedral operates fiscally on the calendar year. Pledges need not be paid now and may be adjusted during the year. Payments, which are tax deductible, may be made on your schedule, in a lump sum or installments, in cash, by check, credit card, or stock transfer. There are several payment options, and you may select the one that works best for you.

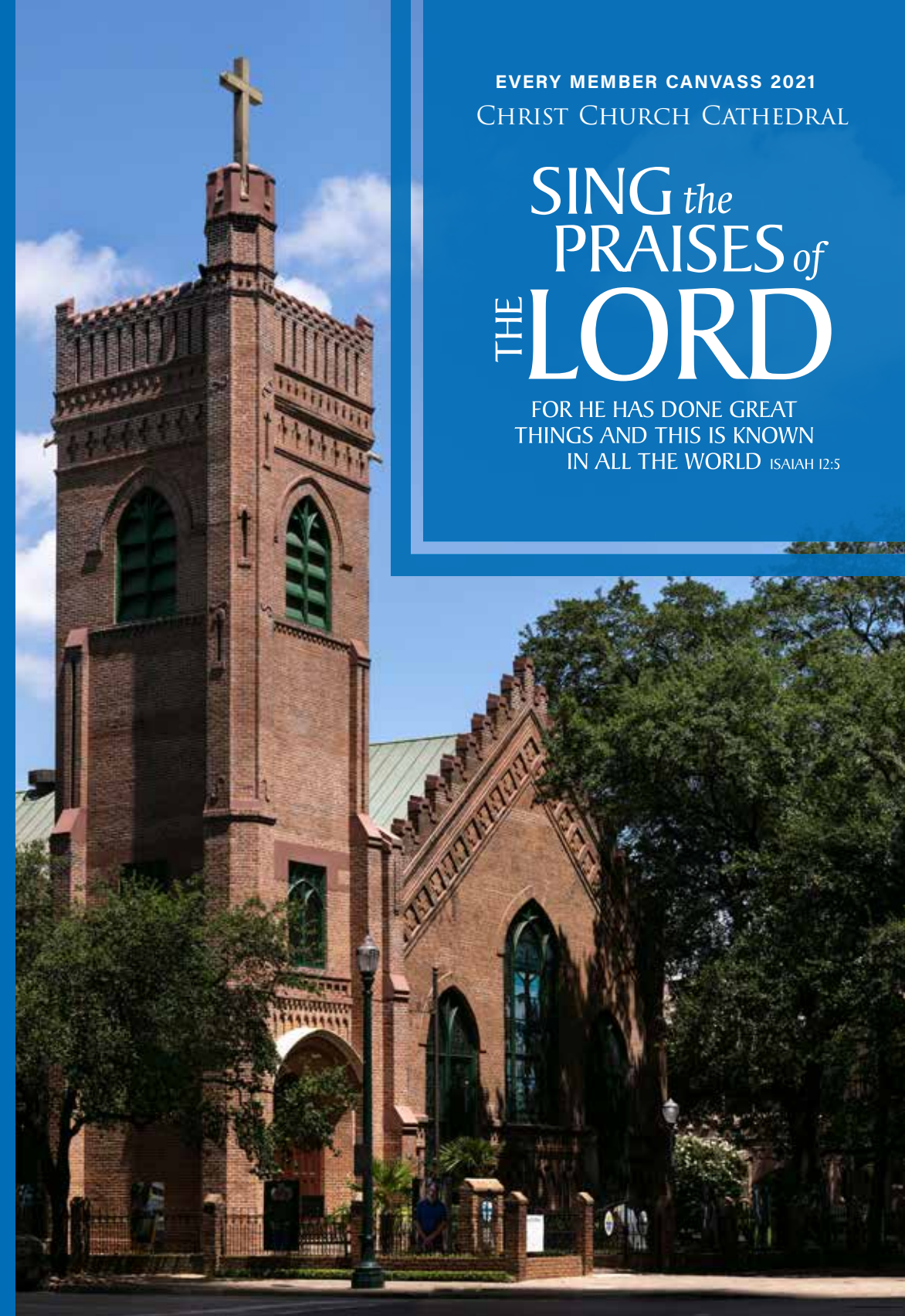
Have you considered additional 2020 Tax Benefits?

During the Advent season, we enjoy working with other families to host Las Posadas, a gathering that commemorates the journey of Joseph and Mary, awaiting the arrival of baby Jesus.

Carol & Andy: Carol's father grew up at Christ Church, and was even crowned prince of the May Fete one year. Her parents were married at the Cathedral, and she was confirmed and baptized here. We have been active for many years, serving the parish in various ways. We both served on the vestry as senior and junior wardens, have been called to serve on multiple councils, and watched our children acolyte on Sundays and get confirmed. One of our great joys has been being part of this community while building The Beacon and continuing to watch it acknowledge and meet the needs of those who live on the margins. We are so proud of all that the Cathedral has accomplished and its ability to continue to make a difference in the lives of so many.
