Welcome to Christ Church Cathedral! Fully vaccinated worshipers are encouraged to wear masks indoors on campus. Worshipers who are not fully vaccinated, including children over the age of two, are expected to wear masks.

We have a socially distanced and masked seating section available. The east transept and first rows near the pulpit are reserved for those who choose both to physically distance and wear masks. If you're sitting in the marked sections, you're expected to wear masks and sit socially distanced.

We have resumed administering wine at Holy Communion. Intinction (i.e.-dipping the wafer in the chalice) is permitted. However, in accordance with Bishop Doyle's guidelines, at Communion we will not drink from the common cup. It is also acceptable to receive bread but not wine, as each element of Communion contains a full measure of grace. The congregation will be invited to the altar rail to receive Communion. If you choose to sit in the area reserved for physical distance, Communion will be brought to you in your pew.


THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God.



Music Notes

During Advent, the *Gloria* we sing at the beginning of our service for much of the year is replaced by the *Trisagion*, an ancient hymn translated “Thrice Holy.” It is thought to be modeled on the passage found in Isaiah 6:3, “Holy, holy’ holy Lord,” on which the *Sanctus* is also based. Though its use in Russian and Greek Orthodox worship dates from the 5th century, it was only with the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer* that it was introduced into the worship of the Episcopal Church. The musical setting is by Alexander Arkhangelsky (1846-1924), an influential Russian composer, conductor, and reformer. He is credited with being the first person in Russia to employ women rather than boys in the performance of sacred music. — *RLS*
