Participating Organizations

The Abundant Harvest food pantry nourishes over 1,200 families monthly, while extending services to more than 120 Veterans each month. Your contributions will fortify our mission to Feed the body, Nourish the soul and Transform the community.

- \$10 Provides lunch for someone at our cafe.
- \$50 Gives a week worth of groceries to a family of four.
- \$100 Covers the transportation costs to pick up donations from local grocery stores
- \$250 Covers the costs to feed 100 seniors at a restricted-income apartment complex

At Risk Youth provides prompt financial assistance benefitting low income working families, whose children are enrolled in the Houston Public School System. These families have typically experienced an unexpected crisis that undermines their financial stability. COVID variants combined with employment uncertainties, unsafe apartments, health emergencies, weather related disasters, wage theft, domestic violence and assault, and the threat of eviction are among the many issues these families encounter. At Risk Youth is a Cathedral ministry operated entirely by volunteers, with no overhead. One month's rent and utilities average \$900 a month. Any amount contributed provides welcome relief and restores educational and financial stability to a grateful family.

The Beacon's mission is to provide essential and next-step services to restore hope and help end homelessness in Houston. These services include hot meals, access to showers, laundry service, mailbox privileges, pastoral care, pro bono legal services, counselling and mentoring, case management, housing assessment, and navigation.

Cathedral Missions organizes all mission trips for individuals at Christ Church Cathedral. Rising 6th grade students through adults can participate.

Centro Paula Escañó (CPE) is located on the border between the Dominican Republic and Haiti. It trains socio-cultural leaders and coordinators to improve the relationship between Haitians and Dominicans. CPE is involved in projects such as training young leaders, teachers and pastoral agents in both Haiti and the DR. Since the earthquake in 2010, CPE has focused on emergency aid and emotional recovery workshops with teachers who then spread these techniques of recovery to their families, students, and neighbors in the camps. CPE also assists pregnant women coming to the DR from Haiti because the hospital conditions are better on the Dominican side of the border.

Combined Arms (CAX) mission is to accelerate the impact of veterans and military families, while fundamentally redesigning the military transition process through innovation and collaboration. Since 2015, we've served 50k individuals across the state of Texas, connecting them to our growing network of 177 member organizations that provide 700+ social services resources.

CUSE (Cathedral Urban Service Experience) delivers lasting urban service experiences by bringing together populations in need. We connect faith and non-faith-based organizations to help them support the underserved in Houston. Effectively CUSE acts as a matchmaker, linking groups of volunteers with an appropriate urban service project.

Education Across Borders is a non-profit organization working in Haiti and the Dominican Republic whose mission is to transform communities through relationship. The island of Hispaniola, originally colonized by Spain and France, still bears the scars of colonialism and exploitation. In Haiti, 70% of the populace lives in extreme poverty, 72% lack basic sanitation, and 50% lack clean water. In the DR, where Haitians increasingly seek a better life, the reality is still grim. Your gift will support:

- Access to sanitation, housing, and medicine.
- Youth education from pre-school through trade school or university.

The Emergency Aid Coalition (EAC) is an interfaith organization that collaborates to provide temporary assistance in the form of food, clothing, and other basic needs, with an emphasis on serving the working poor.

Have Shears Will Travel provides free grooming services to over 700 each month for those in need due to physical impairment, lack of transportation, or financial means. We are expanding with the opening of Shear Success Barber & Cosmetology Training Center to provide a career opportunity in the hair industry accessible for those who need it most.

Kids Hope is an outreach and community service program of Christ Church Cathedral. An all-volunteer cohort provides one-on-one mentoring, reading, and academic support to at-risk public-school students that are referred. Volunteers work closely with partner schools to provide needed school and program supplies, uniforms, and books.

- \$10 Materials kit for one student to participate in a Kids Hope Holiday Craft or Lego Imagination Build event

Living Hope Wheelchair Association provides survival services for people with spinal cord injuries and other disabilities — many of whom lack benefits, insurance, or stable income. The association provides medical supplies, equipment, and transportation support for members, and open spaces for them to be part of the community.

Lord of the Streets is a church community that Restores and Rebuilds lives through ministries and relationships with people facing homelessness.
